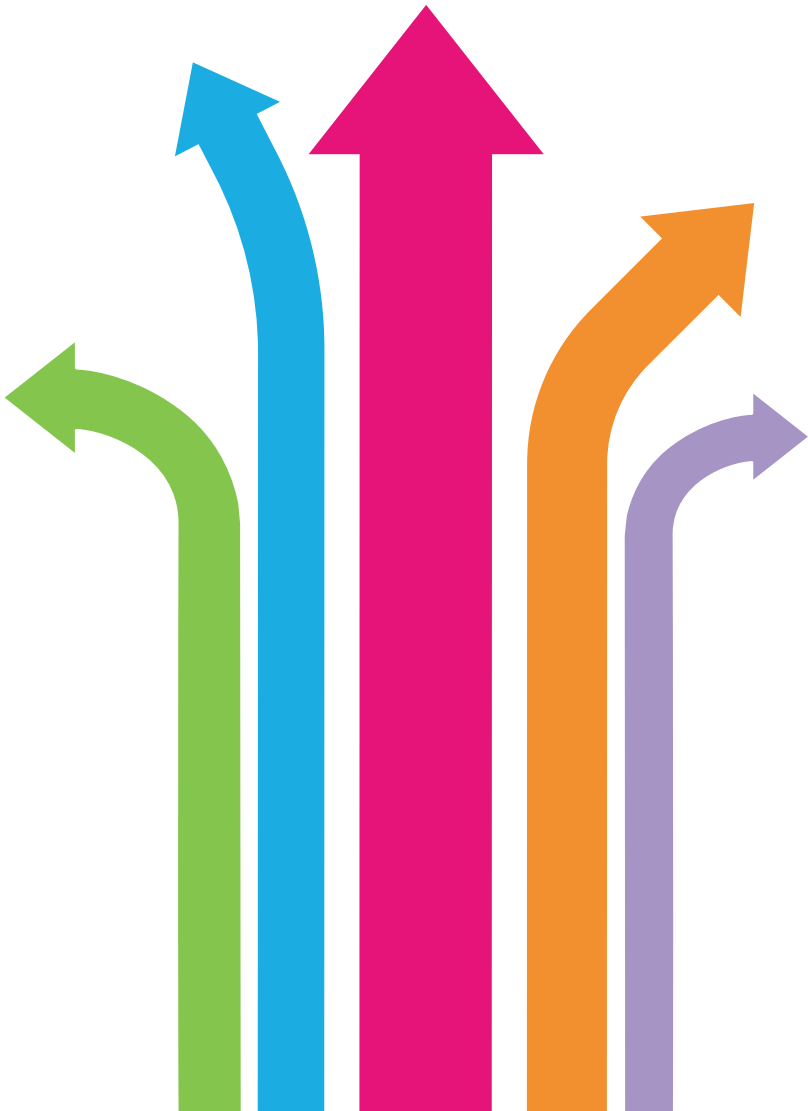

# ACADEMIC Pathways

---

Hereford Sixth Form College has the widest choice of academic courses in the region, with more than 40 A Levels and Level 3 Vocational Courses. Students can create their own individual programme of study, consisting of three options and in some cases four options. A Levels take up one option; vocational courses can take up one to two options (see the infographic on page 3).

This booklet is designed to inform potential students and their parents/guardians on academic based pathways, for those wishing to follow an **A Level only** Programme of Study. This approach is important for students who are academically gifted and/or with a future career aim or university course in mind.





Several careers are outlined within the booklet, along with information on potential Higher Education choices and career prospects. The College has extensive experience of supporting students to obtain university offers for highly competitive universities and courses. A recommended Programme of Study is provided which will enable our students to compete with others at the top academic level.

Our experienced Careers Team are available at our Open Events, for those wishing to discuss their options in greater detail. We also hold talks for potential applicants who may apply for Competitive Universities, including those applying for Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine. These talks expand on this booklet and give further information on the excellent support students receive as part of our Reach Programme and Academic Masterclasses.

## **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

To gain a place on a Level 3 course, you will need at least five GCSEs at grades 4 - 9 or A\* - C including English Language. If you have not achieved grade 4 or above in English Language or Mathematics, you will be expected to study these subjects at Hereford Sixth Form College until the minimum requirement grade has been achieved.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To gain a place on a Level 3 course, you will need at least five GCSEs at grades 4 - 9 or A\* - C including English Language. If you have not achieved grade 4 or above in English Language or Mathematics, you will be expected to study these subjects at Hereford Sixth Form College until the minimum requirement grade has been achieved.

## CREATING YOUR OWN PROGRAMME OF STUDY

Most students considering an academic pathway at Hereford Sixth Form take three A levels, which gives them capacity to take half an A level in Core Maths in their 1st year, or an EPQ in their 2nd year, should they wish. University offers are based upon a three A level programme.

However, students who take up Fast Track Maths will do Mathematics A level at the end of year 1, and Further Maths A level at the end of year 2. These students will have 4 A levels when they finish.

Some students do choose to take 4 A levels for their two years, but this workload is challenging, and is only suggested for students who enjoy a very demanding academic programme. Four A levels is not recommended for those studying Art or Drama A levels, because of the additional time requirements of these two subjects.

# Architecture

---

Universities will want a portfolio of work, and will want you to learn about architecture in your spare time. An EPQ focussing on architecture may really help.

# Engineering

The average salary for jobs in Engineering in the UK is £39,000, but can rise to much higher. Biomedical Engineers earn an average of £35,000 and Data Engineer have an average salary of £56,000.

# APPLYING TO Competitive Universities

---

If you are academic and are aiming for high very GCSE grades, you may want to consider applying to top universities in the future. Higher Tier universities, which include Oxford, Cambridge, Imperial, and Russell Group universities, are very selective. These are some of the most competitive courses and universities in the world, so you need to choose subjects that help you compete with others at the top academic level.

Higher Tier universities may want you to have studied two **traditional A Levels** (once known as facilitating subjects), and another A Level. Take a look at the list of traditional A Levels Hereford Sixth Form College offers to see what would work for you.

Competitive universities have complex application processes. Research what you need to do to apply to the university of your choice, such as admissions tests, or extra work to apply. You may need to apply early to university for these places and courses.
