# Responsibility

## Introduction

This policy statement sets out the college's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the college for the purposes of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the college's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

### Student Entitlement

Students in years 12 and 13 are entitled

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through careers webinars, Careers IMPACT sessions, group discussions and taster events.
- To understand how to make application for the full range of academic and technical courses.
