1. General preparation for A level Spanish

There are lots of things you can do to keep learning Spanish. Independent students who seek out a variety of activities and practise on their own initiative tend to thrive at A level.

Grammar

Having a good grounding in grammar helps you to speak and write your thoughts in correct Spanish.

Learn and practise how to conjugate verbs in each tense. For each tense learn the rules for regular verbs and then for the irregular verbs.
